What is a Ticket to Work Network?

Ticket to Work is an Australia Wide initiative coordinated by a National Manager. Local Ticket to Work Networks bring relevant stakeholders together to:

- source work experience/volunteering/employment opportunities for local young people with disability
- develop or assist with work readiness programs
- promote education/training opportunities to people with a disability
- raise awareness of the current issues facing young people with a disability in their career pathways and other areas

Who can join?

- Career Coordinators/School support staff
- Business owners/industry representatives
- Community/Youth Organisation representatives
- Disability/Employment Service representatives
- Other interested parties (e.g. local government representatives)

What is expected of members?

The BGK TTW Network will meet 4 times per year (once a term) and members are asked to attend at least 3 of these meetings. Members may also choose to become involved in working groups who then may meet more regularly/as required. While other contributions (such as those mentioned above) are valued and encouraged, members are not measured on these outcomes.
