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## WHAT IS STRUCTURED WORKPLACE LEARNING?

Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) is a component of a nationally recognised vocational education and training (VET) course. It is undertaken within the Vocational Major (<u>https://www.vic.gov.au/many-talents-one-vce</u>). The SWL program enables students to apply their class learning out in the real world, working with local businesses.

#### WHAT IS INVOLVED IN SWL?

SWL involves a 1 day a week or block placement (both for a minimum of 5 days) where students are placed with a local business that is aligned to their VET certificate. E.g. A student studying Certificate 2 Building and Construction could be placed with one of many building and construction businesses such as plumbing, electrical or carpentry. Placements can be flexible and tailored to your needs.

## WHY BE A PART OF THE SWL PROGRAM?

SWL offers businesses a chance to develop students' skills specific to their business whilst giving a young person a chance to get a taste of the industry they are interested in before leaving school. The benefits of the SWL program to businesses are:

- Mould a potential employee that fits your business
- Support a young person's career choice and aspirations
- Opening doors and opportunities for a young person
- Additional help from a young person who is eager to learn
- Gaining a young person's perspective on your business and business processes



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# Communication

- Communicate with BGKLLEN to develop a placement opportunity that outlines your expectations
- Be open to giving a student a go
- Ensure the SWL forms have been signed prior to a student commencing placement
- Allow students the opportunity to shadow, ask questions and participate in skill appropriate tasks
- Contact BGKLLEN for extra support if needed throughout the placement

# Payment and Insurance

- Students are required to be paid a minimum of \$5.00 per day
- This payment is not a reflection of a students work performance, but rather a reimbursement of expenses associated with the placement. e.g. travel
- This payment is necessary to deem students as "workers" and to allow them to be covered under the school's insurance.
- Students completing placement in a not-for-profit organisation are expected to donate the whole or part of their payment back to the organisation.
- No payment is to be made to a student who is undertaking placement in a Commonwealth Department Body.
- Payment does not include payment in kind, E.g. gift card/voucher

# Child Safety Standards

Businesses are not required to have a Working With Children's Check If a business decides to continue a student placement beyond 20 days, new SWL forms are to be signed along with the SWL exemption form.



#### WHAT IS BGKLLEN'S ROLE?

BGKLLEN is 1 of 31 Local Learning and Employment Networks around Victoria. LLEN's are not-for-profit organisations funded by the Department of Education to broker partnerships between schools and local businesses. We coordinate the SWL program by developing relationships with local businesses to create work placement opportunities. This gives students real industry experience, helps develops their skills and increases their chances of future employment.

Schools and students can access these opportunities by connecting with BGKLLEN.

#### **BGKLLEN SUPPORTS BUSINESSES BY:**

- Taking the stress out of managing a placement program
- Finding a student who is the right fit for your business
- Supporting the business through the placement process
- Managing and monitoring placements
- Informing the business of post placement options, for example:
  - School based apprenticeship/traineeships
  - Headstart apprenticeship/traineeship
  - Part-time employment
  - Full-time employment
  - Full-time apprenticeship/traineeship

# HOW DOES BGKLLEN LINK STUDENTS TO YOUR BUSINESS?

Placement opportunities are accessible to students and schools on the state-wide Structured Workplace Learning portal. Just like SEEK, this portal allows students to see local opportunities, view employer expectations and requirements involved in a placement.



# Step 1.

With your input, BGKLLEN writes up an opportunity description that is uploaded to the SWL portal. To enable your opportunity to go up onto the portal, a Host Agreement Form is to be signed.

## Step 2.

Students express their interest in a placement opportunity via the portal, allowing BGKLLEN to begin the screening process.

## Step 3.

BGKLLEN contacts the business with student information, checking business capacity and availability to host a student.

## Step 4.

Once the business has confirmed their availability, BGKLLEN notifies a student to make contact with the employer to arrange a time for an interview.

# Step 5.

BGKLLEN supports business and tracks placement progress.



# WHAT ARE SCHOOL BASED & HEADSTART APPRENTICESHIPS?

Headstart and school based apprenticeships/traineeships allow students to combine part-time study of a nationally recognised VET certificate and paid work, whilst completing secondary school. For more information, click on the links below (School Based and Head Start)
