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WHAT IS STRUCTURED WORKPLACE LEARNING?

Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) is a component of a nationally recognised vocational education and training (VET) course. It is undertaken as part of the Vocational Major. The SWL program enables students to apply their class learning out in the real world, working with local businesses.

WHAT IS INVOLVED IN SWL?

SWL involves placement for 1 day a week or a block placement (both for a minimum of 5 days) where students are placed with a local business that is aligned to their VET certificate. E.g. A student studying Certificate 2 Building and Construction could be placed with one of many building and construction businesses such as a Plumbing, Electrical or Carpentry.

HOW IS A STUDENT PLACED?

A student can use their personal connections, school alumni or BGKLLEN to make first contact with local businesses. Students are then encouraged to make a time for an interview with the potential employer.



WHAT IS NEEDED TO ARRANGE A PLACEMENT?

Students need to be well prepared for calling potential businesses and feel confident being interviewed.

Making First Contact

When making first contact with the business, students need to inform the employer of the following:

- Type of placement (1 day a week or 1- week block)
- · Length of the placement including the start and end dates
- Arrange an interview time

Before the interview

- Encourage students to research the industry and business
- Ensure students are aware of the employer's expectations
- Ensure students have the relevant work requirements E.g.
 Construction Card/ volunteer WWCC

During the interview

- · Specify placement location, hours, transport and work wear
- Students are required to have the SWL agreement form signed by the employer

WHAT IS NEEDED PRIOR TO STARTING A PLACEMENT?

The SWL forms must be signed by the school and parents and returned to the employer prior to officially starting the placement.

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POST PLACEMENT OPTIONS

Students can spend a maximum of 20 days with 1 employer, however if they wish to stay longer new SWL forms and an exemption form must be signed. If the employer has the capacity, there may be the opportunity for a student to move into a School Based or Headstart apprenticeship/ traineeship or full time apprenticeship/ traineeship/ employment. HOW CAN BGKLLEN HELP?

BGKLLEN is 1 of 31 Local Learning and Employment Networks around Victoria. They are a not-for-profit organisation funded by the Department of Education to broker partnerships between schools and local businesses. We coordinate the SWL program by developing relationships with local businesses to create work placement opportunities. Schools and students can access these opportunities by connecting with BGKLLEN.

WHY CONNECT WITH BGKLLEN?

BGKLLEN connects students with local businesses giving them real industry experience, developing their skills and increasing their chances of future employment.



WHAT IS THE SWL PORTAL?

Head to the SWL portal to start searching for available placement opportunities locally and around Victoria. BGKLLEN uploads local opportunities on the portal for teachers and students to read about and to express their interest.



HOW CAN OPPORTUNITIES BE ACCESSED?

Step 1.

Contact BGKLLEN to receive portal training which will enable access and use of the portal.

Step 2.

Students can share opportunities they are interested in with their teachers.

Step 3.

BGKLLEN will liaise with the school to organise placement.

Step 4.

Once a business has confirmed availability the school and student can organise an interview.



WHAT ARE SCHOOL BASED & HEADSTART APPRENTICESHIPS?

Headstart and school based apprenticeships/traineeships allow students of combine part-time study of a nationally recognised VET certificate and paid work, whilst completing secondary school. For more information, follow the links below.

WHAT IS SWL RECOGNITION?

SWL recognition is available for students who undertake SWL in an industry aligned to the VCE VET program they are enrolled in. SWL recognition is also available for students undertaking a school-based apprenticeship or traineeship (SBAT). In order to receive credit students need to maintain and complete their Workplace Learning Record (WLR).
